Have You Read Your Rules Lately?

This is a reminder that the Rules and Regulations are in effect and being enforced. All Residents and their guests are expected to know and abide by these rules. New Rules and Regulations Update-The new rules and regulations were voted on and adopted by the Board of Directors on May 27, 2022. You can access the Rules and Regulations by going to our website at orangeharbormhc.com, click on the documents tab, click on community rules, and click on the pdf file.

Approved by the Board of Directors on May 27, 2022 The purpose of these Rules and Regulations is to promote the comfort, welfare, and safety of the residents of ORANGE HARBOR MOBILE HOME AND RV RESORT and to improve and maintain the appearance and reputation of the Corporation.

These Rules and Regulations have been established by the Board of Directors of ORANGE HARBOR CO-OP, INC. (hereinafter called the "Coop"), the owner of the community, and may be changed by them from time to time to achieve this and other purposes. Notice of changes in these Rules and Regulations shall be given to the residents at least 90 days prior to the date of the implementation of the changes.

IV. MANUFACTURED HOME SITES

1. Manufactured home shall be attractively maintained and comply with all applicable laws, ordinances and regulations of state, county, or community as from time to time amended. Each manufactured home shall have skirting, a carport, outside storage shed and a concrete driveway. Skirting that has deteriorated to a point where it has fallen off the home must be repaired or replaced. Replacement design is limited to original design or management approved similar design. Replacement material is limited to original material or management approved similar material. Homes must be maintained year-round even when residents are gone.

2. The home and lot must be kept free of debris. The carport must be maintained in a neat and orderly condition. Outside storage shed must be maintained. Storage outside of the manufactured home will be permitted only in approved utility room/storage shed attached under carport roof. Any new outside storage shed must be approved by management prior to construction.

3. The use of foil, corrugated cardboard, paper, or sheets to cover window and glass doors are unsightly and are not permitted. Curtains, window shades or mini blinds are permitted.

4. No resident shall have a citizen's band or ham radio antenna placed on their lot, unless approved by management. Residents are allowed to install and maintain antennas used to receive video programming in accordance with Section 207 of the Telecommunication Act of 1996. This Federal Communications Commission rule allows residents to install video antennas including direct-to-home satellite dishes that are less than one meter in diameter, TV antennas and wireless cable antennas. This rule does not apply to citizen's band or ham radio antenna.

5. Before digging on the lot for trees, shrubs, large flowering plants, etc., residents must first have written permission from management to avoid damage to underground facilities and for lawn maintenance considerations. No plants or trees can be planted or removed unless written permission is received from management.



Swimming Pool

The pool is open from sunrise to sunset. All guests 14 and under must be accompanied by an adult. If you remove the pool rope that is across the pool separating the deep end to the shallow end, **PLEASE PUT IT BACK**. We will be fined if safety protocol is not followed.

Library

The library is full of books, puzzles, and games in the clubhouse. Please return them when you are finished.

Billiards

Be sure to use our new billiards table in the clubhouse. Please respect the rules pertaining to them.

Ice Machine

The ice cube machine is in the clubhouse. Please use the scooper provided, take maximum 3 scoops, and please close the lid.

Bocce Ball

Enjoy our bocce ball courts with all the equipment you need near the court located next to the clubhouse parking lot.

Shuffleboard

Shuffleboard equipment is for everyone's use and can be found in the shed next to the court.

Storage and Boat Slips

There 41 storage spaces on the premises and 17 Boat slips. All spaces are rented annually and are rented first come, first served. Please contact the office for prices.

Clubhouse

The clubhouse is in the heart of the community. It is where we host a lot of our activities. It is available to rent for special occasions. Please contact Denise Miller at 603-493-1719.

Garbage Disposal and Plant Cuttings

There is a dumpster and plant cutting trailer available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Please do not put large items in the trash compactor. All large items need to be paid for with the proper sticker from the office. Please place the appropriate items in the correct trailer.

<u>Boat Ramps</u>

We have two boats ramps in the park. One is located near the office and the other is next to gypsy hall near the RV section. Please do not park trucks or trailers where they will be towed when launching your boat.

Horseshoe Pits

There are horseshoe courts near the pavilion and pool. Please replace the equipment when done using.

Fishing Pier & Fish Cleaning Station

There is a fishing pier available to all residents on the NW side of the park. Please obey all fishing regulations and dispose of your used fishing line in the proper waste bin that is available at the pier. There is a fish cleaning station in the RV park that has a cutting surface and running water. Please dispose of your fish carcasses appropriately.

Dog Park

For your convenience there is a fenced in dog park open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week for your pets. There are dog waste bags and bins. **PLEASE** clean up after your pet.

Pavilions

There are two pavilions on the premises. One is located near the pool and the other is located in the RV section. They are available for rent for special occasions. Please contact Denise Miller at 603-493-1719 to make a reservation.

Do Not Put FROG Into the Drain!

Help us prevent fats, rags, oils and grease clog/blockages in the sewer system. Raw or partially treated sewage can back up into homes or flow into the streets, rivers, and bay. Do not put the

following items down the drain: Food scraps, butter, margarine, cooking oils, sauces, dairy products, greasy leftovers. Facial tissues, baby wipes, disinfectant wipes, moist wipes, toilet bowl scrub pads, napkins, paper towels, dental floss, eggshells, nutshells, bones and coffee grounds, hair, sanitary napkins, tampons, condoms. Vitamins, medicines, sheet plastic, or plastic of any kind, diapers. **The best recommendation for toilet paper is that it is made from 100% recycled materials.**



We Recycle on Fridays

Please place your handle towards your house and the open side toward the street for proper pickup!

Recycle Smart-5 For the Cart:

Paper-junk mail, newsprint, magazines, copy paper, phone books, etc. **DO NOT** put in used paper towels, tissues, napkins.

Metal cans-aluminum or steel (tin) cans. No need to remove labels or crush cans.

Cardboard-Any kind of box unless it held a liquid (such as those to hold milk, juice, wine, and broth). Pizza box lids can be recycled, the bottoms can be recycled if they do not have any food residue on them.

Plastic Containers-Look for the number 1-7 within the recycle triangles on the bottom of the container (no Styrofoam, no plastic bags) Lids can be either on or off. **Glass**-green, brown, and clear bottles and jars. Literature provided by Lee County Southwest Florida website leegov.com

Tuesdays & Fridays - Garbage pick-up Please put your garbage out first thing in the morning, so animals won't get into it.

and clean and keep the door closed! If you have an issue with a dryer or washer, PLEASE write down what the problem is so the repairman can repair it correctly. Either let the office know and place a note on that machine. It will save us a service call!

PWC-Personal Watercraft

Like most states, Florida has some interesting boating regulations, one regards the hours of operation for PWC.

The regulation for hours of operation is very straight forward. It says in 327.39 subsection 3, "A person may not operate a personal watercraft at any time between the hours from one-half hour after sunset to one-half hour before sunrise."

The Navigation Rules govern what a vessel operator must do in different situations on the water. The rules have one purpose, to prevent collisions! Under the Navigation Rules all vessels are required to display certain light configurations depending on several factors.

Recreational vessels have four class designations and PWCs, which are normally under 16 feet in length, are considered Class A vessels. What we are faced with are two different regulations that apply to PWCs. In Florida it is OK to operate one-half hour before sunrise and until one-half hour after sunset. The Florida law only regulates the time of operation. The Navigation Rules require a Class A power driven vessel to display navigation lights during a specific situation, one of which is the hours between sunset and sunrise. PWCs don't come with navigation lights installed at the factory. The operator must purchase and install proper navigation lights if they want to operate between sunset and sunrise.

There are Federal rules for required equipment on all vessels including having the vessel registration on board, and the state numbers and decal must be properly displayed. A sound producing device, type B fire extinguisher and visual distress signals are also necessary.

The operator and all passengers must be wearing speed rated life jackets. In addition, the operator must have an engine cutoff switch attached themselves in some fashion.


In Florida no one under the age of 14 may operate a PWC and you must be 18 to rent one. Like all vessel operators born on or after January 1, 1988, you must have a Florida Boating Safety I.D. card. There are several ways to obtain a Florida Boating Safety I.D. card, <u>www.myfwc.com</u> has a list of state approved providers. Locally you can find in-person classes offered by the United States Coast Guard. Always practice safe boating!

Save the Manatee Club is an award-winning national nonprofit 501(c) (3) and membership-based organization established in 1981 by renowned singer/songwriter, Jimmy Buffett, and former U.S. Senator, Bob Graham, when he was governor of Florida.

This organization helps with manatee research, public awareness and education, rescue and rehabilitation, and advocates for stronger protection. Manatees are Florida's official state marine mammal. The IUCN World Conservation Union lists them as vulnerable at the international level. They are listed as threatened at the federal level by the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service and at the state level by the Florida Fish & Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC). Their listing status is largely due to human activity. Since record-keeping began in 1974, more than 41% of manatee deaths where the cause of death was identified were humanrelated—and almost 34% were due to watercraft collisions (the largest known cause of manatee deaths). With increased awareness, education, regulations, and enforcement, manatee deaths caused by humans could be substantially reduced, and the eventual recovery of the species could be realized.


OURROC-SWF WWW.OURROC-SWF.ORG

Protecting Our Mangroves

One of nature's best defense systems for parts of the U.S. coast under threat from hurricanes each year is a group of gnarly trees called **mangroves**. These trees only grow in tropical and subtropical climates since they cannot withstand freezing temperatures. They make up dense forests in saltwater areas along parts of the Gulf Coast that feature intricately intertwined root systems, which give the appearance that the trees are walking on the water. Those interlocking roots help protect coastlines from flooding when hurricanes hit. They break down that wave energy; in doing so, they reduce how far the floodwaters penetrate inland. The trees also help stabilize coastlines and guard against erosion.

Mangrove forests capture massive amounts of carbon dioxide emissions and other greenhouse gases from the atmosphere, and then trap and store them in their carbon-rich flooded soils for millennia. This is an important ecosystem service as we face climate change. This buried carbon is known as "blue carbon" because it is stored underwater in coastal ecosystems like mangrove forests, seagrass beds and salt marshes. The complex mangrove root systems filter nitrates, phosphates and other pollutants from the water, improving the water quality flowing from rivers and streams into the estuarine and ocean environment

The dense forests also serve as home to a variety of animals, such as crabs, birds, fish and iguanas. Estuarine habitats with coastal mangrove shorelines and tree roots are often important spawning and nursery territory for juvenile marine species including shrimp, crabs, and many sport and commercial fish species such as redfish, snook and tarpons. Branches of the mangroves act as bird rookeries and nesting areas for coastal wading birds including egrets, herons, cormorants and roseate spoonbills. In some areas, red mangrove roots are ideal for oysters, which can attach to the portion of the roots that hang into the water. Endangered species such as the smalltooth sawfish, manatee, hawksbill sea turtle, Key Deer and the Florida panther rely on this habitat during some stage of their life cycle.

The nation's largest mangrove forest, which is also one of the largest in the world, is found in Southwest Florida. According to U.S. Fish and Wildlife, the Ten Thousand Islands National Wildlife Refuge is home to 232 square miles of mangrove forest.

Threats to Mangrove Forests

Unfortunately, there are many challenges that place mangrove forests under threat. Human impact such as dredging, filling, water pollution from herbicides and development can lead to mangrove erosion and habitat destruction. When mangrove forests are cleared and destroyed, they release massive amounts of carbon dioxide into the atmosphere, contributing to climate change.

According to U.S. Fish and Wildlife, it is estimated that a fifth of the world's mangrove systems were lost to habitat degradation and development from 1980 to 2010. Climate change also poses a threat, The mangroves may not be able to keep up with sea-level rise, they may be flooded to the extent they may start to die off, and a storm can knock them off more easily than in the past.

In 1996, the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP) implemented the Mangrove Trimming and Preservation Act. This Act regulates the trimming and alteration of mangroves while also banning the use of herbicides and other chemicals used to defoliate mangroves. Mangroves cannot be removed, trimmed, or disturbed without a permit from the Florida Department of Environmental Protection.

FOOD SAFETY

Preventing Food Poisoning During the

Holidays Feasting with family is part of many holiday

celebrations. Follow these tips to help prevent food poisoning, or foodborne illness, during the holidays.

Keep foods separated. Keep meat, chicken, turkey, seafood, and eggs separate from all other foods at the grocery store and in the refrigerator. Prevent juices from meat, chicken, turkey, and seafood from dripping or leaking onto other foods by keeping them in containers or sealed plastic bags. Store eggs in their original carton in the main compartment of the refrigerator.

Cook food thoroughly. Use a food thermometer to make sure meat, chicken, turkey, seafood, and eggs have been cooked to a safe internal temperature to kill germs. Roasts, chops, steaks, and fresh ham should rest for 3 minutes after you remove them from the oven or grill.

Keep food out of the "danger zone." Bacteria can grow rapidly in the danger zone between 40°F and 140°F. After food is prepared, keep hot food hot and cold food cold. Refrigerate or freeze perishable food like meat, chicken, turkey, seafood, eggs, cut fruit, cooked rice, and leftovers within 2 hours (1 hour if food is exposed to temperatures above 90°F, such as in a hot car). The temperature in your refrigerator should be set at 40°F or below and the freezer at 0°F or below.

Use pasteurized eggs for dishes containing raw eggs.

Salmonella and other harmful germs can live on both the outside and inside of normal-looking eggs. Many holiday favorites contain raw eggs, including eggnog, tiramisu, hollandaise sauce, and Caesar dressing. Always use pasteurized eggs when making these and other foods made with raw eggs.

Do not eat raw dough or batter. Dough and batter made with flour or eggs can contain harmful germs, such as E. coli and Salmonella. Do not taste or eat raw dough or batter that is meant to be baked or cooked. This includes dough or batter for cookies, cakes, pies, biscuits, pancakes, tortillas, pizza, or crafts. Do not let children taste raw dough or batter or play with dough at home or in restaurants. Some companies and stores offer edible cookie dough that uses heat-treated flour and pasteurized eggs or no eggs. Read the label carefully to make sure the dough is meant to be eaten without baking or cooking. **Thaw your turkey safely**. Thaw turkey in the refrigerator, in a sink of cold water (change the water every 30 minutes), or in the microwave. Do not thaw turkey or other foods on the counter. A turkey must thaw at a safe temperature to prevent harmful germs from growing rapidly. Learn more about preparing turkey safely.

Wash your hands with soap and water during these key times when you are likely to get and spread germs:

- Before, during, and after preparing food.
- Before eating food
- After handling pet food or pet treats or touching pets
- After using the toilet
- After changing diapers or cleaning up a child who has used the toilet
- After touching garbage
- Before and after caring for someone who is sick
- Before and after treating a cut or wound
- After blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing

Check My Contract allows these policyholders to submit repair contracts to DFS for independent review to gather any potential evidence of insurance fraud against Florida policyholders, especially following storms and ensure the contract complies with Florida Law.

When filing your contract for review, in the email, please provide the following:

- Full name of contracted company and/or individual.
- Consumer Name.
- Consumer Address.
- Consumer Phone number and/or email.
- Type of insurance coverage (Homeowner, Condo Unit Owner, Mobile Home, Dwelling Fire, Windstorm, Flood)
- Full name of insurance company.
- Policy number.
- Claim number.
- A non-original copy of the full contract; and
- A detailed explanation of the issue and any additional information or documentation that supports your concerns.


The Orange River is an "Idle" zone river all season long.

"Idle Speed, No Wake" Zone: A designated area where vessels must be operated at a speed no greater than that which is necessary to maintain steerage and headway. The vessel should not produce a wake at this speed.

The Caloosahatchee River has a "slow wake" from November 15 to March 31.

Slow-No Wake means operating a boat at the slowest speed necessary to maintain steerage and reduces or eliminates waves that appear as white water behind the boat. the same location frequently.

Resume normal operating speed from April 1-November 14.

Zoom Etiquette

Reliable, easy-to-use video platforms like Zoom have helped to restore the ability to hold meetings during difficult times. The challenges and benefits of Zoom meetings can be much different than in-person meetings. The advantage of virtual meetings is the ability to hold them almost anywhere and have more people participate from anywhere, but there are dos and don'ts associated with participating in a Zoom meeting.

✓ Zoom "Best Practices"

- ✓ You should try to attend the meeting from a quiet area that has a neutral background.
- ✓ Eliminate distractions-noises (dog barking, dishwasher, voices in the background, TV, etc.) and movement going on around you.
- ✓ Wear proper attire-not your pajamas or go shirtless.
- ✓ Avoid distracting behaviors-ironing, eating, moving around, etc.
- ✓ Don't do private things-brush or floss your teeth, shave, etc.

REMEMBER: THE CAMERA SEES EVERYTHING & EVERYONE ON ZOOM CAN SEE YOU. While we like to see everyone, you do not have to participate using video to attend a Zoom meeting. You do not have to have your camera on to see what is going on at the meeting either. Another option is to just cover up your camera lens at the top of the screen with a post-it note. If you choose to have your camera on, aim the camera 'straight' at your face (not from a position that looks up your nose) and try to follow the Zoom "best practices".

You then will press the number 9 on your phone, repeatedly, if need be, and the gate will open. If you do not want to look for your special code, your visitor can follow the steps on the pin pad of the kiosk. If you have any questions, please stop in, or call the office.


